PREVIOUS RESULTS

LAST NIGHT:

After the Sweets took a 5-0 lead through the third inning, the Wenatchee Applesox battled back with a run each in the 4th, 5th and 6th. J.J. Robinson then hit a three-run homer in the bottom of the 6th to give the Sweets another five-run lead, but after a Trenton Brooks RBI single in the 7th, Joe Gillette of the Applesox hit a grand slam to left, tying the game at 8-8. Jarod Gonzales hit a sacrifice fly to put the Sweets in front again in the bottom half. The Applesox would re-tie the game at 9-9 with a Ty Jackson RBI single in the 8th, but neither team would score again until the bottom of the 14th inning, when Andrew Mendenhall hit a walk-off, RBI single off of Wenatchee reliever Clark McKittrick.

THE BIG PICTURE:

Last night's wild ride placed the Sweets in sole possession of second place in the East division, four games behind first-place Yakima Valley. The Sweets took the season series from the Applesox, six game to three, and also won their fifth consecutive league series. Tonight is Walla Walla's series opener with the West division's last-place Kitsap Bluejackets, who had the day off yesterday, following a 3-2 loss to Cowlitz on Tuesday.
