**PREVIOUS RESULTS**

**LAST NIGHT:**

The Sweets could not hold down the Bluejackets, who crushed four homers en route to an 11-4 upset win. D'Aundray Van Slyke hit two homers, and Zach Larsen and Dylan LaVelle added one each. The eleven Kitsap runs came on 18 hits, and starting pitcher Mike Paulson took the loss, allowing the first seven runs but also striking out seven batters. Moe Handcox was the star at the plate for the Sweets, hitting two home runs of his own--his first homer of the season was a solo shot in the 3rd inning, and his second was a two-run dinger in the 5th, both coming against Kitsap starter Josh Moss, who got the win after 6 1/3 innings pitched.

**THE BIG PICTURE:**

Combined with Wenatchee's 11-1 win over Yakima Valley last night, the opening loss to Kitsap puts the Sweets back into a second-place tie with the Applesox. Because the Pippins also lost, however, the Sweets have not lost ground in the WCL East division race, still just four games out of first place. A win tonight will tie the series and give the Sweets a chance at their sixth straight series win in league play.
