**PREVIOUS RESULTS**

**LAST NIGHT:**

Trailing 8-1 entering the bottom of the 7th inning, the Sweets instilled fear in the Pippins by staging a late comeback. Kyle Nixon hit a two-RBI double in the 7th, Mike Paulson cracked a two-run homer in the 8th, and Andrew Mendenhall knocked a two-run single in the 9th. A following double by Parker Osborne put the tying and winning runs in scoring position, but Yakima Valley reliever Nick Kern worked out of the jam to send the Sweets away with an 8-7 loss. After a rough outing from Chris Kerwood, who received the loss, the bullpen helped keep the game close with 7 1/3 innings of one-run ball--a combined effort by Jake Campeau, Cody Mathews, Garrett Barker and newcomer A.J. Carkner.

**THE BIG PICTURE:**

The series-opening loss sunk the Sweets back down to four games out of first place. The next two games are crucial, as the Sweets will resume their push to close the gap in the standings against first-place Yakima Valley, in what will be the teams' final two matchups of the season. Additionally, Wenatchee tightened its hold on second place with a win over Victoria Tuesday night. Look for the division race to heat up more as the season nears its end.
